This matter is before us on the United States’ *Unopposed Motion to Remand*. The United States moves to remand this case to allow the district court to reconsider its sentencing decisions in light of *United States v. Blackbird*, 949 F.3d 530 (10th Cir. 2020) and *United States v. Englehart*, 22 F.4th 1197 (10th Cir. 2022). Appellant Jalen Wolfelkins Harris does not oppose the motion.

Upon consideration, the *Motion to Remand* is granted. Mr. Harris’s sentence is vacated, and this matter is remanded with instructions to the district court to conduct
